ROOM AT THE INN TRANSFORMS LIVES, ONE PERSON AT A TIME

The jovial group gathered in the lower level of Manchester United Methodist Church laughed over dinner. At one end of the table, the chairman of the board of a St. Louis utility was promising the homeless architect that she would hear from the head of the utility for a job interview. At the other end, the group of 20-somethings was laughing like old friends, although they had just met. In between, motherly types were offering comfort and encouragement to the apprehensive young woman on her own for the first time.

This scene plays out night after night when Room at the Inn clients stay at our partner congregations. Rarely

is it an uncomfortable assembly of strangers. Rather, the evening gathering quickly becomes a celebration of caring. Room at the Inn volunteers quickly come to understand a fundamental fact: people who are homeless are people first. Their homeless status is almost always a new and fleeting circumstance; it does not define who they are. Each person who arrives at the shelter has his or her own personality, his or her own history.

The clients gathered around that dinner table included an expectant mother, a mother with her son, single women, an older woman, and a married couple. There is no single face of "the homeless." There is no one story. Each year, we see 200 individuals, 200 different causes of homelessness, 200 different heartaches and 200 different paths to self-reliance.

"We are here to serve everyone," says Program Director Sr. Joann Nowak, OSF. "Sometimes our clients are homeless because of bad choices or financial mismanagement, but sometimes they were doing everything right when a crisis struck. Regardless, they all need and deserve our help."

Room at the Inn has more than 50 agencies available to help meet the individual needs of our clients. Every program participant creates a plan, a roadmap to regain self-reliance. Room at the Inn staff guide them, referring them to agencies whose services fit the particular needs of the resident. For instance, Lesly Jackson, a former

client, completed a six-week housing class, which helped her qualify for an apartment. Room at the Inn helped Lesly pay her back utility bills, removing that obstacle to housing. "They assisted me with resources to help me get back on my feet," Lesly said, noting that Room at the Inn also got her to a health clinic and helped her with medications. Financially stable once again, Lesly gives back by serving on the Room at the Inn program board.

Room at the Inn is about people helping people. It's about restoring a vision, a hope, a dream. It's about transforming lives. While at the shelter, clients learn new skills and new ways of looking at the world. They learn that life is manageable. They learn they have the power to direct their lives.

IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

Partner congregations provided:

- At least 21,230 hours of overnight accommodations, plus transportation, meal preparation and service, and other hospitality.
- Approximately 14,600 meals (two each day for up to 20 people).

CLIENT OUTCOMES

100% of clients received transportation to needed services.

100% of heads-of-household were made aware of housing options.

100% of school-aged children were either attending school or in the enrollment process within three days of arriving at Room at the Inn.

100% of clients staying more than four days were made aware of and referred to appropriate outside social service agencies.

100% of adult clients staying more than seven days received a physical health evaluation.

100% of adult clients staying more than seven days received a mental health evaluation.

85% of adult clients staying more than seven days received a substance abuse evaluation.

94% of clients had incomes below the Health & Human Services Poverty Guideline when they entered Room at the Inn; average income was 41% of the poverty level; 20% had no income.

Average stay was 34 days.

It's not often one has the opportunity to help change a life, but Room at the Inn staff and volunteers do just that every day. Many people feel compassion for the homeless of our community but are unsure of the best way to help. At Room at the Inn, our volunteers transport, shelter, feed and interact with our clients. It is a personal, hands-on way to help neighbors in need.

Room at the Inn volunteers number well into the hundreds. Every evening, volunteers from Room at the Inn's partner congregations transport our clients to their church or temple, where they provide an evening meal, companionship and a safe place to sleep. In the morning, the volunteers serve breakfast and return the clients to the permanent shelter in Bridgeton.

"I admire the people who step up to host because they have it in their hearts ... they're the angels, I'm an organizer," said Peggy Bennington, night site coordinator for Manchester United Methodist Church, which has hosted Room clients for nearly 16 years. Peggy notes that her parish involvement with the
